

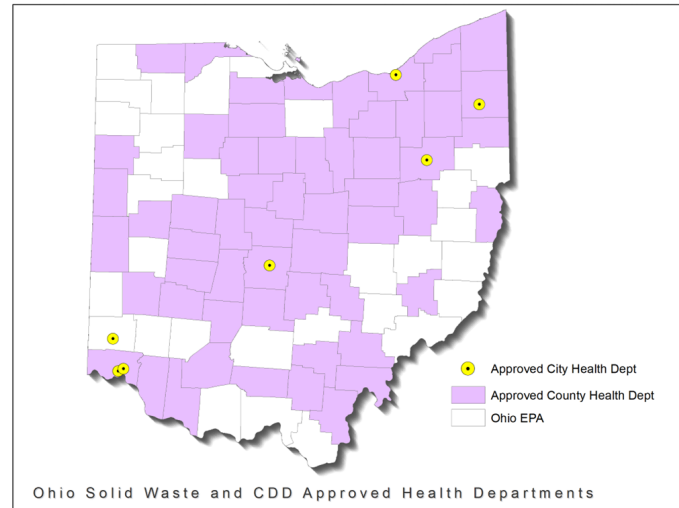
Construction and Demolition Debris (CDD)

Fees Collected and Funding Distribution

Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 3714. requires owners and operators of C&DD facilities and MSW facilities to collect:
 ·\$0.80 per cubic yard of C&DD disposed,
 OR; ·\$1.60 per ton of C&DD disposed.

ORC 3714.07: The money retained by a board of health shall be paid into a special fund, which is hereby created in each health district, and used solely for the following purposes:

- To administer and enforce this chapter and rules adopted under it;
- To abate abandoned accumulations of construction and demolition debris as provided in section 3714.074 of the Revised Code.



Perry County is one of the 65 Approved County Health Departments in Ohio.

ORC 3745.02: The director may reduce or waive disposal fees if the governor declares a state of emergency.

City and County appropriations are optional. A City or Township can enact an ordinance or adopt a resolution. County Commissioners can also adopt a resolution, allowing fees to go to their general fund. If these funds are collected, amounts are distributed out of the local \$0.54.
