Under the direction of the Director of Health Education and Grants Management, the Child Injury Prevention Coordinator will implement the Ohio Department of Health approved grant workplan, which includes objectives such as working with community partners to lead a county-wide Child Injury Prevention Coalition, becoming trained as a Child Passenger Safety Technician, working with law enforcement and other community partners to host car seat safety events, and working with community partners to lessen the immediate and long-term effects of Adverse Childhood Experience's (ACE's). The Child Injury Prevention Coordinator will also develop population-based strategies to tailor educational and prevention efforts to children ages 0 to 18.

The successful candidate will have a minimum of 1-2 years of public health, health education or nursing related experience. A bachelor's degree in public health, health promotion, health education or related field is preferred but not required. Applicants must have a valid Ohio Driver's License, with ongoing proof of auto insurance. Candidates should possess a demonstrated ability to work collaboratively, build relationships, organize and manage multiple projects, manage a budget, and maintain a focus on end goals. A desire to collaborate with community partners to improve health and the ability to inform the public about policies, programs, and resources is required.
