Jim has been an active and engaged member of Community Heart Watch for 7+ years and is a Champion for "Smart AED" initiative in Perry County. Jim was instrumental in placing 45 Avive AED's and has trained 1,428 people at 14 events in 3 years with the Mobile CPR Training Unit. He has helped launch the first Heart Safe Park in Perry County (Somerset Memorial Park and assisted with the accreditation of Perry County District Library and Village of New Lexington as "Heart Safe Businesses". Jim is an ultimate Perry County advocate that assisted in 5 grants for AED's totaling \$21,955 and helped place 70 traditional AED's in our community. We commend Jim on his sensational contributions to help our community thrive!
